Re: REDACTED civil harassment restraining-order packet

Dear REDACTED,

We looked through the documents you sent us. A few items appear worth checking before anything is filed or signed, so we listed them below in the order that may be most helpful.

Here are the items that may be worth checking before the documents are filed or signed:

- The client name appears as "REDACTED" on the court forms, while the signature on CH-100 page 7 appears to read "REDACTED" and the medical exhibit uses "REDACTED." Please check the intended full name and make the name presentation consistent where appropriate so the documents do not appear to identify different people.
- CH-100 page 3 describes a prior incident between REDACTED that may have led to a hospital visit, but Exhibit 1 is dated REDACTED. Please check whether this is the intended supporting record and whether the incident dates and exhibit description should be clarified so the attachment is not mistaken for a different event.
- Exhibit 1 contains sensitive medical information and personal identifiers, including a full birth date and patient identification number. Before any public filing or service, the filer may wish to check with the court clerk or a licensed attorney whether the exhibit copy should be handled or prepared differently without repeating those identifiers elsewhere.
- On CH-100 page 2, the box indicating that a separate Attachment 4 is being used appears checked, but the relationship explanation appears on the form itself and no Attachment 4 appears in the packet. Please check whether the box or the packet should be corrected so an attachment does not appear to be missing.

- CH-100 page 7 leaves the number of attached pages blank, although the merged CH-100 file appears to include an Exhibit 1 cover and three medical-record pages. Please check the intended attachment count and add it if appropriate so the stated packet contents match the actual pages.
- The case-name field on CM-010 page 1 appears blank even though the other documents identify the two people. Please check whether a case name should be entered so the cover sheet can be matched to the rest of the packet.
- CM-010 page 2 includes a date and typed name, but the signature line appears blank. Please check whether the intended signer still needs to sign before the form is used.
- On CH-100 page 1, neither Yes nor No appears selected for the question asking whether protection is requested for another family or household member, even though **REDACTED** is listed and CH-110 item 3 is selected. Please check the intended response and make the selections consistent.
- CH-100 page 7 appears to place "**REDACTED**" in the lawyer-name area even though the lawyer information is blank elsewhere and the related lawyer date and signature lines are blank. Please check whether that entry belongs there so the signer's role is clear.
- The prior-incident paragraph on CH-100 page 3 says the Respondent threatened to kill the Respondent if the dog hurt his cat. That wording may identify the same person as both the speaker and the threatened person, so please check which person was intended and revise the role label for clarity.
- The CH-100 narrative uses "Plaintiff" and "Defendant" in some places and "Petitioner" and "Respondent" in others. The packet may be clearer if the intended role labels are made consistent throughout the narrative.
- The age line for the person seeking protection on CH-100 page 1 appears blank, while CLETS-001 page 2 lists an age. Please check whether the CH-100 entry should be completed to match the packet.
- CLETS-001 page 1 describes the vehicle type as a **REDACTED** and the model as **REDACTED**. Those two entries may not describe the vehicle the same way, so please confirm the intended vehicle type and model.
- CH-100 page 6 spells the dog's breed as "**REDACTED**." If "**REDACTED**" is intended, correcting the spelling may make the animal description clearer.

- A few CH-100 narrative sentences may benefit from proofreading, including “Plaintiff has dog” on page 3 and the comma-joined sentence about **REDACTED** on page 1. Please check the missing word, punctuation, and sentence breaks so the descriptions read clearly.
- The Exhibit 1 cover identifies the attachment only as “Exhibit ‘1’” and does not appear to show the party names, case description, or the form item it supports. Please check whether additional identification would help keep the exhibit connected to the correct packet.

## REDACTED – Checklist

- [ ] Check the intended full client name and make the name presentation consistent across the court forms, signature, and medical exhibit.
- [ ] Check whether the REDACTED medical record is the intended exhibit for the incident described as occurring between REDACTED.
- [ ] Check with the filer, court clerk, or a licensed attorney how the sensitive medical information and personal identifiers in Exhibit 1 should be handled before public filing or service.
- [ ] Check the Attachment 4 box on CH-100 page 2 and either correct the selection or include the intended attachment.
- [ ] Check the attachment count on CH-100 page 7 against the exhibit cover and three medical-record pages.
- [ ] Check whether the case-name field on CM-010 page 1 should be completed.
- [ ] Check whether CM-010 page 2 still needs the intended signature.
- [ ] Check the Yes-or-No selection for additional protected persons on CH-100 page 1 and make it consistent with the listed person and CH-110.
- [ ] Check whether “REDACTED” should remain in the lawyer-name area on CH-100 page 7.
- [ ] Check which person was intended in the CH-100 page 3 sentence stating that the Respondent threatened to kill the Respondent.
- [ ] Make the party-role wording consistent throughout the CH-100 narrative.
- [ ] Check whether the age line on CH-100 page 1 should be completed consistently with CLETS-001.
- [ ] Confirm the vehicle type and model listed on CLETS-001 page 1.
- [ ] Check whether “REDACTED” on CH-100 page 6 should read “REDACTED.”
- [ ] Proofread the CH-100 narrative for the missing word and punctuation issues on pages 1 and 3.
- [ ] Check whether the Exhibit 1 cover should identify the parties, packet, or related form item more clearly.
